MIDDLE SCHOOL INFO...

AFTER SCHOOL LIBRARY PROGRAM

- The after-school Library program is available from 3-5 pm Mon - Thurs for any student wanting homework help or a quiet place to study. It is staffed by MS teachers.
- Students must arrive by 3:15 pm and stay until 5 pm unless other arrangements have been made between a parent and the teacher ahead of time or students are taking the late bus (see below for times).
- Parents/ Guardians will be contacted via phone if a student is scheduled to show up and doesn't.
- *Please note that the Library Program will <u>NOT</u> be open on the <u>1st TUESDAY of every month</u> due to a school-wide faculty meeting.

ARRIVAL DISMISSAL


The District is moving to a new communication tool - ParentSquare!


In the past we used Remind for communication with teachers and coaches, and School Messenger for District level communication. We are now bringing all of these platforms together with ParentSquare!

MPORTANT DISMISSAL CHANGES

WEDNESDAYS ONLY

- On Wednesdays, students in MS and HS will be dismissed before the ES students at <u>2:25 pm</u>. *This will NOT impact dismissal time for ES students.
- This will result in all ES, MS, and HS <u>bussers</u> arriving home approximately 20 minutes earlier than usual on WEDNESDAYS.
- This change was made to support important work that the MS & HS departments engage in to provide your students with the best access to their education.

AFTER SCHOOL LIBRARY PROGRAM

- The after-school Library program will still be available at dismissal (2:25 p.m.) for students on Wednesdays
- Students will be expected to stay until 5 pm unless other arrangements have been made between a parent and the teacher ahead of time or students are taking the late bus.

WHY IS SCHOOL ATTENDANCE SO IMPORTANT?

School attendance is an important indicator of how successful a student will be in school. Because of this, we strive to have every student here, on-time, every day! When students aren't in the classroom, they are missing out on the teaching, discussion, collaboration, and engagement that takes place in the classroom with their teachers and classmates.

According to research, "Students who attend school regularly have been shown to achieve at higher levels than students who do not have regular attendance. This relationship between attendance and achievement may appear early in a child's school career."

LET'S WORK TOGETHER!

- Make school an expectation. Talk with your child about the importance of attending school each day, and make it a priority!
- Don't let your child stay home unless they are truly sick.
- Help your child establish a regular routine.

- Communicate with the school and your child's teacher if your child will be absent for any reason. Keep track of your child's attendance through SchoolTool.
- If your child has been absent, help them monitor the work they missed and take advantage of the after-school library program to help them get caught up.



CODE OF CONDUCT INFO

Last year we had great success with the implementation of our new expectations for personal technology device usage. Our Middle School students left their phones and smartwatches safely in their lockers with the exception of lunchtime. This small change had huge positive impacts on student engagement, social interaction, and discipline. CELL PHONES

Policy as written in the MCSD Code of Conduct:

- Student cell phones and other personal electronic devices, <u>including</u> <u>smartwatches</u>, must be stored in student lockers during the instructional day
- Students will be permitted to use their personal electronic devices during their lunch period

Consequences will include a relinquishment of the electronic device to the school administration and may yield suspension from school for repeated violations.

*Please note that the MS Office follows the following protocol:

1st offense: Relinquish of device to Main
Office until end of day

2nd offense: Relinquish of device to Main
Office & parent phone call

3rd offense: Relinquish of device & parent required to pick up device

*additional violations may result in

disciplinary action

DRESS CODE

Policy as written in the MCSD Code of Conduct:

A student's dress shall:

- Not include open-back shirts/blouses, tube tops, sports bras, or tops with large cutouts on the side
- Shirts must be long enough to cover the majority of the abdomen and provide adequate coverage at the neckline
- Not include costume apparel with the exception of special events
- Not include chains, choke collars, collars with spikes, and other related items that may be considered dangerous



MIDDLE SCHOOL PBIS

WHAT IS PBIS?

PBIS stands for Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports. It is a schoolwide effort to support students' socialemotional wellbeing, and academic success while improving the overall school climate. Our behavioral expectations focus on helping students to be Safe, Respectful, and Responsible in all school settings. When those expectations are not met, we spend time discussing and modeling the expectations several times to try and prevent a disciplinary consequence. PBIS emphasizes relationships between students and the adults in the building as we strive to acknowledge all of the positives we see throughout the school day!



PBIS EXPECTATIONS:

Be Safe

• Make safe and healthy choices.

Be Respectful

• Be considerate towards yourself, others, and property.

Be Responsible

• Do what is expected of you.

PBIS KICK-OFF

We will dedicate time during the first days of school to teach students the behavioral expectations. They will have time to practice Safe, Responsible, and Respectful behavior throughout the school. Students will rotate through stations to learn about appropriate behavior on the bus, in the auditorium during forum and lunch, the hallways, in the bathrooms and locker rooms, in the cafeteria, and in the classroom.

The second day of school will end with a PBIS kick-off event in the auditorium for all students. We hope to have a visit from our blue devil mascot as we celebrate what "true blue" middle school behavior looks like in our building. There will be music, raffles, prizes, and a good time had by all!



Tips for Back-to-School Success

- Establish a morning & evening routine

TECHNOLOGY



- Keep your Chromebook on a flat surface like a table or a desk. (Don't leave it on the floor where someone could step on it.)
- Don't pile things on top of your Chromebook.
- Keep food and drinks away from your Chromebook and make sure your hands are clean.
- Be careful how you carry your Chromebook. Make sure your Chromebook is closed, always use two hands, and never carry your Chromebook by the screen.
