SCHOOL MESSENGER



AFTER SCHOOL LIBRARY PROGRAM

WHY IS SCHOOL ATTENDANCE SO IMPORTANT?

School attendance is an important indicator of how successful a student will be in school. Because of this, we strive to have every student here, on-time, every day! When students aren't in the classroom, they are missing out on the teaching, discussion, collaboration, and engagement that takes place in the classroom with their teachers and classmates.

According to research, "Students who attend school regularly have been shown to achieve at higher levels than students who do not have regular attendance. This relationship between attendance and achievement may appear early in a child's school career."

LET'S WORK TOGETHER!

- Communicate with the school and your child's teacher if your child will be absent for any reason. Keep track of your child's attendance through SchoolTool.
- If your child has been absent, help them monitor the work they missed and take advantage of the after-school library program to help them get caught up.

CODE OF CONDUCT REMINDERS

Last summer, school administration met with members of the community, the BOE, and teachers to discuss the best way to approach the topics of cell phones in school. Our intent is to maintain focus on student learning in a safe, enjoyable, and supportive setting.

CELL PHONES/ SMARTWATCHES

Policy as written in the MCSD Code of Conduct:

- Student cell phones and other personal electronic devices, including smartwatches, must be stored in student lockers during the instructional day
- Students will be permitted to use their personal electronic devices during their lunch period

Consequences will include a relinquishment of the electronic device to the school administration and may yield suspension from school for repeated violations.

DRESS CODE

Policy as written in the MCSD Code of Conduct:

A student's dress shall:

- Not include open-back shirts/blouses, tube tops, sports bras, or tops with large cutouts on the side
- Shirts must be long enough to cover the majority of the abdomen and provide adequate coverage at the neckline
- Not include costume apparel with the exception of special events
- Not include chains, choke collars, collars with spikes, and other related items that may be considered dangerous
